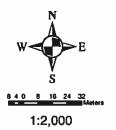


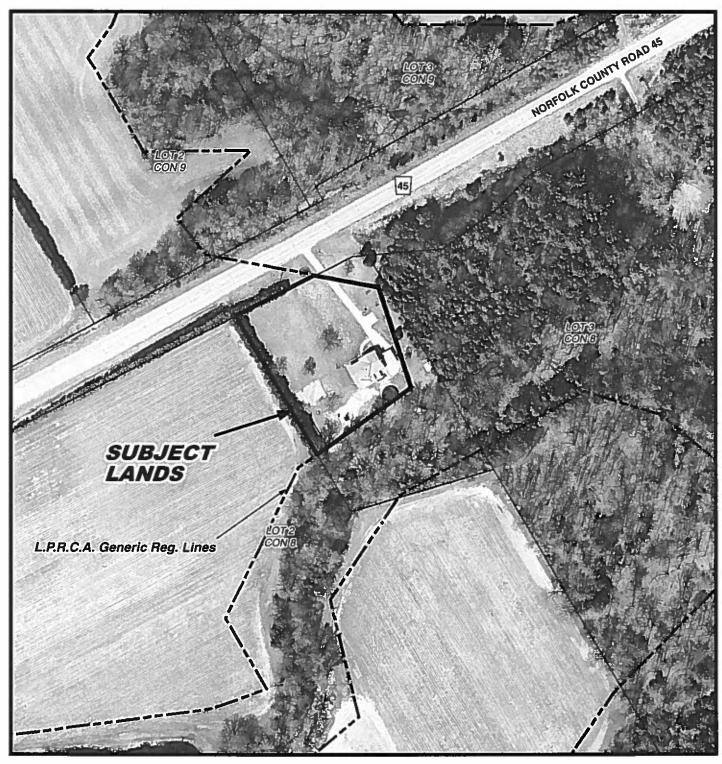


MAP 3
