Complete Application

A complete development application consists of the following:

1. A properly completed and signed application form (signature must be original in planners file);
2. Supporting information adequate to illustrate your proposal as indicated in **Section H** of this application form (plans are required in paper copy and digital PDF format);
3. Written authorization from the registered owner of the subject lands where the applicant is not the owner as per Section N; and,
4. Cash, debit or cheque payable to Norfolk County in the amount set out in the user fees By-Law.

The above information is required to ensure that your application is given full consideration. An incomplete or improperly prepared application will not be accepted and may result in delays during the processing of the application. This application must be typed or printed in ink and completed in full.

Pre-Submission Consultation "Pre-consultation":

A pre-consultation meeting with staff is required for all applications; however, minor applications may be exempted depending on the nature of the proposal, with approval from the Director of Planning or delegate. The purpose of a pre-consultation meeting is to provide the applicant with an opportunity to present the proposed application, discuss potential issues, and for the County and Agency staff to identify the required information and materials to be submitted with the application in order for it to be considered complete. The applicant has the opportunity to make revisions to the application prior to submission, without the additional costs of recirculation fees. It may be necessary to seek the assistance of independent professional help (for example, a planning consultant or engineer) for complex applications. If a pre-consultation meeting has been held to discuss your development, please **include a copy of the Pre-consultation minutes with your application** as part of the submission package. It should be noted that **pre-consultation minutes are valid for one year after the meeting date.**

Development Application Process

Once an application has been deemed complete by a planner, it will be circulated to public agencies and County departments for review and comments. Notice of the application is also provided to adjacent land owners. The comments received assist the planner with the review and recommendation/approval of your application. The time involved in processing an application varies depending upon its complexity and its

acceptability to the other agencies and is subject to statutory *Planning Act* decision timeframes.

An additional fee will be required if a review by the Long Point Region Conservation Authority or by the Grand River Conservation Authority is deemed necessary by planning staff and/or by the Authority. A separate cheque payable to the Long Point Region Conservation Authority or the Grand River Conservation Authority is required in accordance with their fee schedule at the same time your application is submitted.

Additional studies required as part of the complete application shall be at the sole expense of the applicant. It should also be noted that in some instances peer reviews may be necessary to review particular studies and that the cost shall be at the expense of the applicant. The company to complete the peer review shall be selected by the County.

If the application is withdrawn prior to the circulation to commenting agencies, the entire original fee will be refunded. If withdrawn after the circulation to agencies, half the original fee will be refunded. If your drawings are required to be recirculated there will be an additional fee. Also, please note that if your engineering drawings require more than three reviews due to revisions by the owner or failure to revise your engineering drawings as requested, an additional fee will be charged. No refund is available after the public meeting and/or after approval of application.

Notification Sign Requirements

For the purpose of public notification and in order for staff to locate your lands for appropriate applications (zoning, subdivision, condominium or official plan) you will be given a sign to indicate the intent and purpose of your development application. It is your responsibility to:

1. Post one sign per frontage in a conspicuous location on the subject lands;
2. Ensure one sign is posted at the front of the subject lands at least three feet above ground level, not on a tree;
3. Notify the Planner when the sign is in place in order to avoid processing delays; and
4. Maintain the sign until the development application is finalized and thereafter removed.

J. Transfers, Easements and Postponement of Interest

Also, the owner further acknowledges and agrees that it is their solicitor's responsibility on behalf of the owner for the registration of postponements of any charges in favour of the County.

Permission is hereby granted to Norfolk County officers, employees or agents, to enter the premises subject to this application for the purposes of making inspections associated with this application, during normal and reasonable working hours.

To whom it may concern,

I am writing this letter to accompany my application for a Temporary Use By-law. I would like to briefly explain my reasoning for the application. My name is Wendy Thomas, I am a full time nurse (front line worker) at Hardy Terrace Nursing Home in Mt. Pleasant. I have worked there for 27 years. When purchasing our Travel Trailer in 2019 we had plans of traveling around, enjoying family vacations, we soon realized this was not going to be the only use of the trailer. Covid became the new reality the following year.

We decided to utilize the trailer as a safe, comfortable, free alternative from expensive hotels/motels for friends, family and neighbours. I myself used the trailer three times as I recently contacted Covid again in February. I was caring for my elderly mother and have grandchildren (1 currently living with us and another on the way) that often stay at the house. This is a convenient free place to stay. My son, 2 fellow nurses and a neighbour have all used the trailer to self isolate. I have the trailer hooked up on the drive way where it is convenient for me to also assist the occupant in any help they may require. On February the 4th when I was first issued the notice that I had violated the County's Zoning by-law, I was completely shocked and upset to learn that a neighbour had complained about me having my trailer in the driveway. Andrew Battenham (enforcement officer) had explained to me that the bylaw that allows people to quarantine in their motor homes during the pandemic "had expired". I tried explaining to Andrew that the bylaw may have "expired" but I STILL work in LTC where the Covid threat is still a daily struggle for myself and Patients. I understand Andrew does not make the rules, however for me, my family, friends and fellow co-workers Covid has not disappeared. This has been a very disappointing experience for me, as a front line worker I am only trying to serve a purpose to make life easier in an already stressful work environment, not only for myself but for someone else in a difficult situation, I also find it extremely unfair to notice the multiple travel trailers, RV's and fifth wheelers parked in other peoples driveways in Waterford (i have pictures in my original emails of the various homes) who do not appear to be getting notices and having to go through what I am going through. 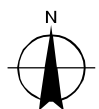

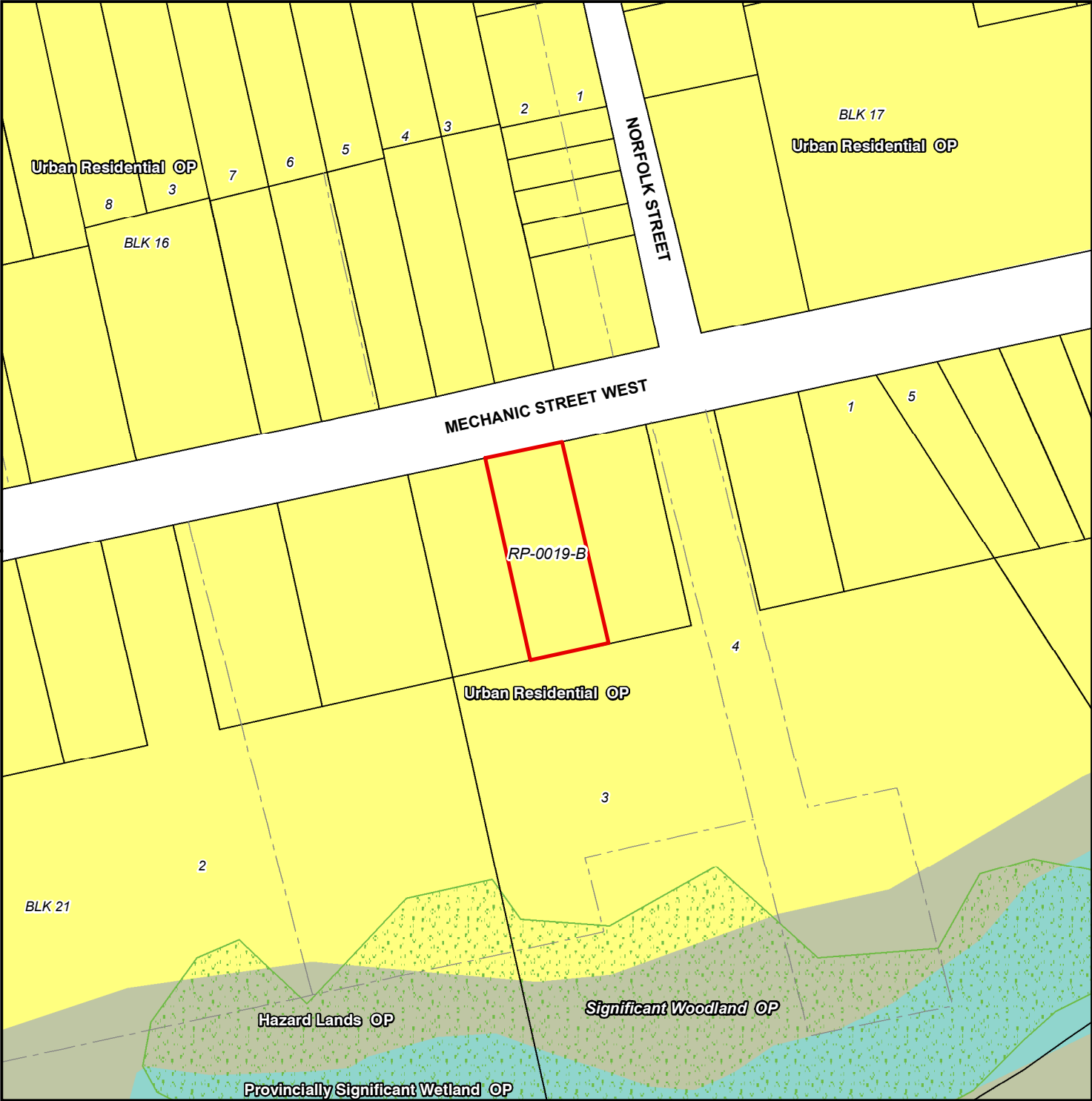

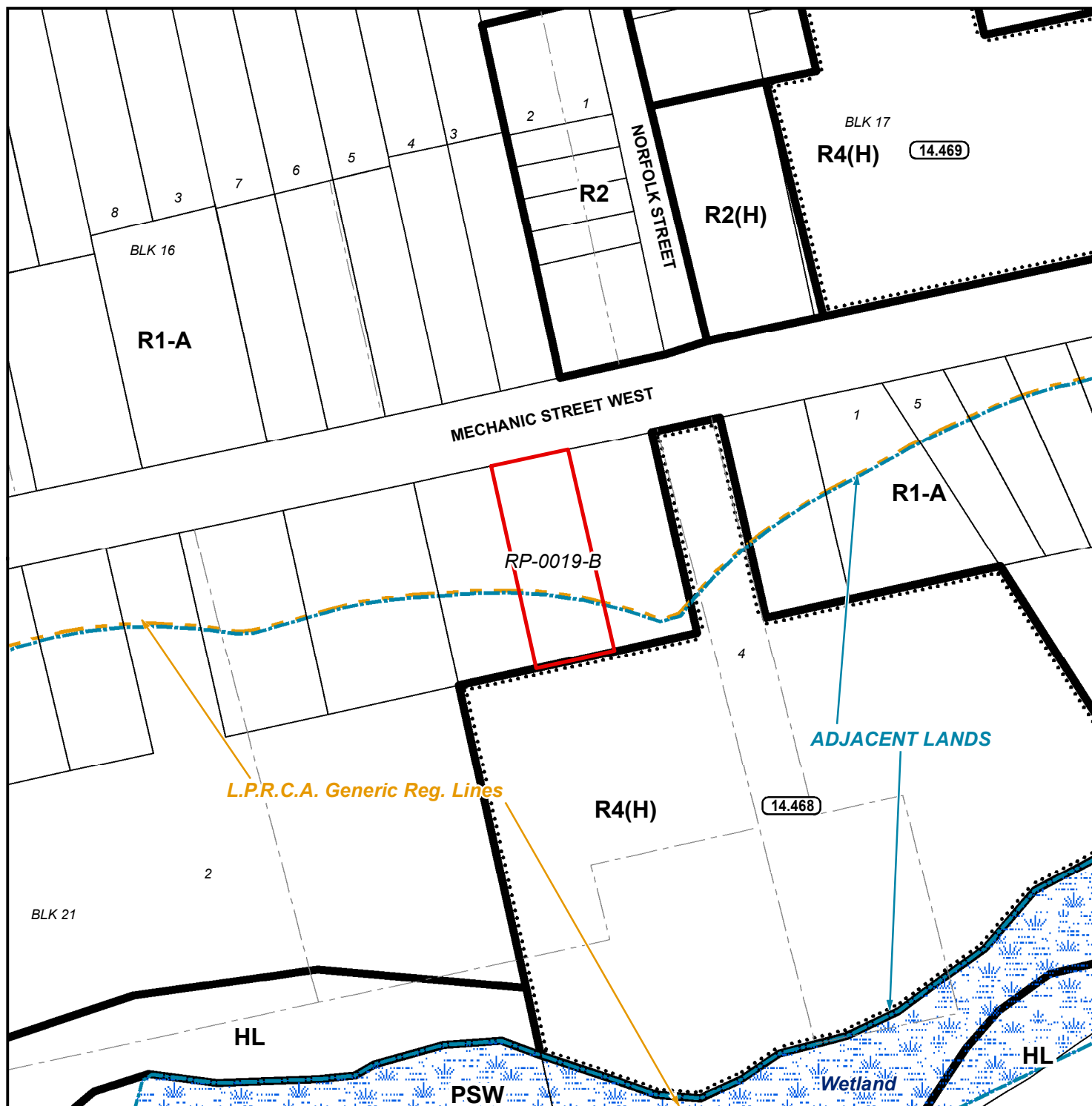

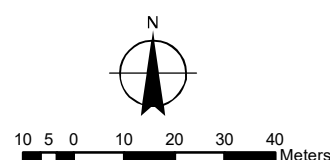

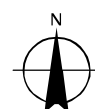
